
Mummy's Afternoon

- A dentist



Paracetamol/ Nurofen and absence periods

Just a polite reminder to all parents that children who are given Paracetamol/Nurofen in the morning are not allowed into Nursery for their session.

Also regarding diarrhoea and sickness, the child <u>must</u>remain away from Nursery for 48 hours after last loose bowel movement or until a formed stool is passed and 48 hours after the last bout of vomiting and ensuring the child is eating and passing food normally
